## Spanish 1



Recommended GPA: 2.0 or higher

Speaking, reading, writing and listening in Spanish

Students will learn journalistic skills, gather information, write clearly, work on planning and meeting deadlines, take pictures, and prepare page layouts.

Students must enjoy writing, be artistic, and use their own time after school for picture taking and informational research.

# Year Long Art

# Digital Media/WPTV

Motivates and prepares students for college.


Students participate in study groups with college tutors, develop strategies for academic success, and visit local universities.



  - The other semester will be art/technology


# Support Classes
